Kayli Christensen Speaks



Kayli Christensen, Treynor graduate, received her doctorate in Physical Therapy this May and accepted a position starting June 6 with Children's Hospital in Omaha. Her last year prior to graduation was spent in clinical rotations which covered

four states. Four weeks were in the Dominican Republic with a program called ILAC, a partnership program with Creighton University.

Stories and pictures of her mom's experience with ILAC always fascinated Kayli as a little girl. Twenty four years later Kayli went with 17 of her classmates for the four-week experience. Professionals also served as mentors in two week periods.

Kayli said the experience was very impactful, changed the course of the way she thinks in her practice now and her awareness of community. She spent her four weeks in Santiago, Dominican Republic, a city of 250,000. ILAC provided a variety of experiences for various teams specific to their educational interests.

Kayli spent her mornings at an orphanage for kids with special needs. Her team worked on helping educate workers on the importance of positioning in feeding the kids, helping them stretch and getting them up to walk. Challenges were having such a low ratio of adults to children and speaking in Spanish but two on their team were quite fluent.

Baseball is a big thing in the Dominican Republic. There were two classmates who creatively helped the kids strengthen their bodies by using old laundry baskets for sled pulls and water bottles filled with rocks for weights.

different in length so a machete type knife was used to saw one off. If you have unused medical aids you could donate, contact Kayli. She also stated the emergency room at the public hospitals are closed from midnight to 5 AM. There are many dire needs.

In the afternoons they were able to visit historical museums and served the Haitian Bateyes. In the 50's Haitians were hired and given small plots of land for them to work in the fields. A hurricane in the 70's left people without government assistance and medical care. Her team administered oral de-parasite meds to the children. Some therapy was provided. Holding their hand, feeding them breakfast affected the children and her, even if they couldn't communicate verbally. Kayli said they were a light to the children, that the ministry of presence and the use of hands is powerful. She was also moved by the power of the children's imagination.

Kayli says she hopes to continue in the pediatric realm with physical therapy. She stated in the US we are so blessed and she wants to use that blessing to go and serve others – trips to Dominican Republic or other countries. She also hopes to be helpful in parts of Omaha where there is also intense poverty. Congrats, Kayli, on your achievements and for your desire to help others!
