Denise Wilson, St Paul Youth Minister, Treynor, accompanied by Katie Weis, Assistant, and Sam and Sydney Burmeister, youth members, told about their summer mission trip to Tulsa, OK.

The mission trip, approximately the 12th year, gives the youth and leaders an opportunity to learn about another community in the US and to gain experience in serving others, focus and bond as a team.

They had a great 2-hr. conversation with Saul Moccasin, 99, a retired teacher and volunteer at Oaks Indian Mission, started in 1801.

The group served at Iron Gate, organizing bags of food for families in cars and giving out individual meals to people on the streets. Sam said it was fun to see the happy faces when he handed out desserts. Over 100 families in cars and hundreds of homeless individuals were served. Denise said it broke her heart to see people her age and younger, who looked way older, in such need. She loved using their name while conversing with them.

They also worked at a Kids Camp at Wesley Chapel, delivering pizza to the homeless or playing with the kids on the playground. This project was a mission of Pastor Chris of the local Methodist church. Due to prayer, pizza, and basketball, this neighborhood was reached and the church is full. Oklahoma City Thunder Basketball team has even funded a basketball court for this neighborhood. Denise said she saw safety issues at the camp, but had to let her feelings go as she saw 70 kids off the street happy and having fun.

Everywhere they went the Treynor youth were praised for giving it their all and for helping because they were understaffed. Denise reported competitiveness added to the fun when sorting food.

Two different churches were attended giving the group different worship experiences. Each day the group had great conversations about their lows and highs for the day. Each person was given a string bracelet and could put 2-3 different colored beads per day on the string which would remind them of people that impacted them and to pray for them.

Their daily schedule was to meet for breakfast, have devotions, and gather for prayer before going to serve. At night they would talk about the devotions and apply how Jesus was calling them to go and serve in love. They started each day by putting God first.

Sam reflected on how the mission trip was a life-changing experience for him helping him be more settled in what his plans are. Sydney stated she is more appreciative of the things we have and the support that our Optimist Club gives. She feels she has a new perspective of noticing when others have a need, being more optimistic and nice to others.
