Jordan Campbell Spoke about Movies



Jordan Campbell discussed a fun topic which led to discussion—Movies! A favorite pastime for him is watching sports of all types, but during COVID-19, with sports events being curtailed, he started watching movies. He would watch 45 mins. after

the kids would go to bed and sometimes finish up over the lunch hour the following day.

Jordan researched the top 250 movies in March of 2020 and shared the list. He rates as he watches with 10 being the best. A rating of 8-10 would be worth watching a second time he stated. He discovered new enjoyment in watching the Star Wars Series and in old ones such as Casablanca. His four top movies were Terminator, Momento, One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest, and Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid.

Jordan also had each member write down their top 3 favorite movies and shared the commonalities. Members shared fun memories of where they saw their first movie, the first movie seen with their spouse, happy movies, sad movies, drive-in movie experiences, and genres of movies preferred.

Several remembered watching movies in Treynor for 25 cents when they were projected on the side of a building on Wed. nights with curtains wrapping the space and sitting on benches. There was no Daylight Savings then. Also stores were open on Wed. night for shopping. A monetary prize could be won if your movie ticket was drawn at intermission.

Kirk Vorthmann recalled kids hitchhiking from Treynor to CB to see a movie and people driving by who would pick them up to get them there.

Most indicated that TV's became a household item in 1950-51. Wrestling and fake wrestling

were popular programs. Gary Gutttau remembered his dad using his 4-H calf winnings to buy their first family TV.

Jordan indicates he watches movies, not through NetFlix, but has Direct TV and records available movies, but he mainly goes to the CB library and rents 5 movies at a time for free. He also told us about Clear Play, which can be used on DVD's, etc. to filter profanity, graphic violence, and sexual innuendos in movies.

Business:

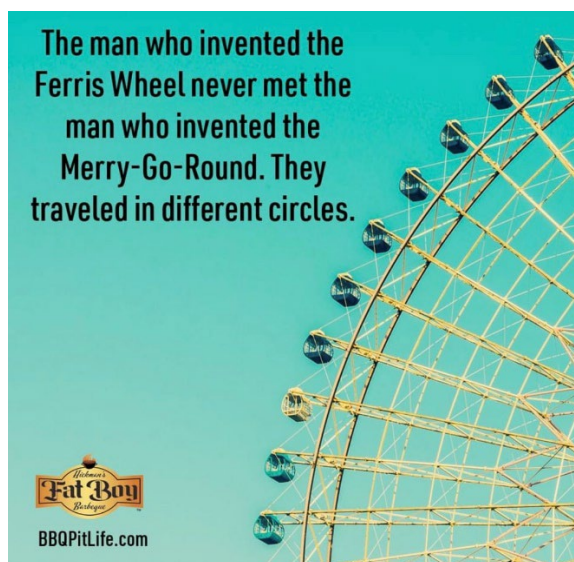
