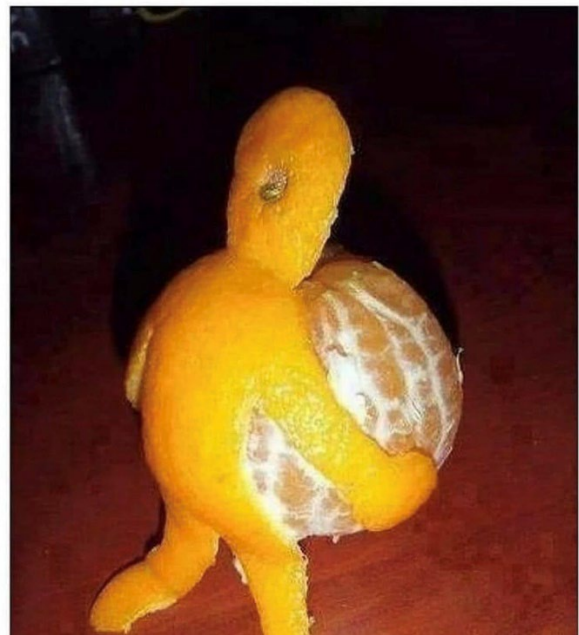
makes it easy to have a party as they have a trailer you pick up and return that has chairs, tables, sound system and yard games for the party. The church even provided the door hangers to announce the event.
