Shelly Bailey, JOI Club Advisor, and More



Shelly Bailey spoke today about her role as JOI (Jr. Optimist International) Club Advisor, serving on the KKAD25 committee and her job as IT Director at Treynor Community School. She is married to Tandy and has two children, Brad and Ashley.

The JOI club meets on the first Wed of each month at 2 PM and has 62 members, up from 49 last year. Haley Nowlin is President, Amelia Hedrick is VP, Cadence Quick is Sect., and Addy Schnepel is Treasurer. Haley is also a regional governor in the state for JOI. Shelly's objective is to provide guidance and ideas at the first meeting, then empower the kids to take control. And they do!

Meetings are short followed by working on service projects. These include tie blankets for the homeless and for Children's Hospital, Treynor Trunk or Treat, and making Cookies for the Troops, which included 205 letters written by Treynor students this year. One platoon wrote back and want to keep writing.

Other projects include helping with the Community Christmas, a Toy Drive which resulted in 150 toys plus \$2000 raised. JOI kids did the shopping for those in need. The club was in the Homecoming parade and also helped clean up at the football field after games.

Upcoming projects include Souper Sunday, non-perishable food items will be collected in the community for those in need. They will also collect old t-shirts to be made into dog toys to give to the animal shelter. The seniors will have priority in helping the 5th graders with Mulch Madness. Helping at New Visons Food Service is another project.

A sub project for JOI Club is known as KKAD25 (Keep Kids Alive Drive 25) which was organized after the death of Tristan White in 2015 while jogging. A grant from State Farm for \$25,000 was won and a local group was organized, under the leadership of Tristan's mom, Lisa White, to make Treynor a safer place to walk, cycle, drive, run, etc.

Projects to create awareness have been: 1) Safety tables at sports events with t-shirts and keychains given away 2) Yard signs, 3) Radar signs at all entrances to Treynor, 4) Light pole banners (which didn't last well), 5) A runner safety speaker, 6) Nathan's running vests, 7) Driver's Ed scholarship, and 8) Sidewalk safety study turned over to the city.

Another \$25,000 was received earmarked for Tristan's Trail. In Sept. 2017 a feasibility, design study was begun with involvement of environmental groups. Two mock crash events have been sponsored (2017 and 2022) which has had great impact on students. The first annual 5K run locally was held in July, 2022.

This year KKAD25 is focusing on partnering with SAFE lowa to increase seat belt use among teens in lowa. Safety promotions will be done at three home games and will include fatal vision goggles, remote car races, and table games with half time drawings.

Shelly also shared about her IT job at Treynor Community School, which she has been doing for 21 years, 17 were full time. There are 9 servers, 1300 devices, 100 wireless access points, 20 switches, 100 phones, 20 printers. She has one half time helper who helps students with their Chrome Books. Her responsibilities are quite inclusive and include webmaster, data base management, Google management, cybersecurity enforcer, heating and lighting controls, communication liaison and social media manager, school safety team lead, marquee manager and more. She plans to retire in 8 years and knows she needs to be able to train someone for four years.
