Treynor Vision Update about The T



Treynor Vision Update about The T

Travis Castle (left), President of Vision Treynor Group, gave an update on The T (Recreation area in Treynor). Also present were two other members of the four member board: Doug Wehring (middle) and Norm Collins (right). All board members are volunteers.

A group of citizens gathered at the Community Building in the fall of 2010 to discuss how the community could be improved with amenities. Vision Treynor was born and filed for a 501©3 (a non-profit organization). The first activity was sending 1000 surveys to residents in the area. 433 were returned indicating four wishes: I) Little League athletic fields, 2) walking trail, 3) fitness center, and 4) a pool.

The next goal was to find a location and have it be a safe place for kids to access as well as others. Benefits would be an economic impact, increase future residential activity, attract new people to town and impact the sustainability of the school district. In 2012 the first fundraiser raised \$250,000. TS Bank kicked in \$500,000 to buy 63 acres north of the cemetery in town. The property was reduced to 54 acres when land was sold to Heartland Properties for the housing development of 29 lots. All lots are sold.

There were set-backs, but in 2017 after not qualifying for an Iowa West Foundation (IWF) grant, Vision Treynor broke the project into increments. Phase 1: they were able to grade the middle third of the property, the entry road, seed the first soccer and baseball field, irrigate and pay for the water line from Hwy 92.

In 2018-2019 Fox Creek Fundraising was used to help with raising more money. A new request was put into IWF to build out the Little League field, purchase field equipment, build a concession stand, develop infrastructure and bring in electricity and sewer. A \$511,000 grant was awarded from IWF, which meant once 66% (\$336,000) of that amount was raised by Vision Treynor, then 34% (\$175,000) would be paid by IWF. When the whole project is complete, then a new request could be sought from IWF.

Funding was obtained to build the first Little League field and in 2022 games were played. Practice for soccer and Little League football also started. In October 2022 the Charles E Lakin Family Foundation granted \$336,000 for a Family Pavilion, which gave them naming rights and this completed the grant requirement from IWF.

The concession stand was redesigned to be a pavilion and will include covered areas, a family gathering room (sheltered area), restrooms plus a lease space for special use, perhaps such as a seasonal ice cream shop.

In 2022 Vision Treynor collaborated with Treynor Parks and Trails group, which includes Splash, Tristan's Trail, and Dexter's playground. The group felt it was important to make The T the main gathering area in town. Treynor Parks and Trails now leases space from VT. The Master Plan has been redrawn. The road has been bumped out 11 acres for additional amenities. (See attachments.)

The future: Grading, electricity and sewer are the next needs. Water is hooked up. The pavillion building will be purchased from Roger Webster. It is hoped it can be completed for use by spring of 2024.

The Master Plan includes space for a future basketball court, pickle board court, corn holes, and a Miracle Field, available to all kids. All of this takes a long time and money.

Currently the annual cost to operate the complex is \$12,000. This past year a \$30 per child was charged for a sport, but that is being discontinued this year. A T Board deals with operations and scheduling. Other ways to fund the expenses will be researched.

One of the original desires was a pool, but because it will cost \$4.5 million, the splash pad is replacing that.

Castle had two asks: 1) a welder to volunteer time (not materials) to build out a batting cage. 2) a small tractor or gator that someone doesn't want anymore. This can be considered a tax write-off since this is a 501©3. Castle also asked people to call him if they hear a rumor or have questions. (402-980-2066)
