# Jenny Berens, Treynor Community School



Jenny Berens is in her 17<sup>th</sup> year at Treynor, changing from Principal to now serving as the <u>Academic Success</u> <u>Advisor and Coach</u>. Berens stated she absolutely loves this position and being back to working with kids.

In her role she is <u>facilitator</u> of the 6-12 Student

Assistance Teams which get together every 4-6 weeks. She supports students in need of assistance by monitoring and responding to student data such as attendance, grades, behaviors, etc. Kids can struggle academically for a variety of reasons. The team develops a plan for each student and tracks data to see if the interventions are working. The team assesses every six weeks and tweak the plans if needed.

She also is the <u>504 Coordinator</u> for grades 6-12. 504 plans are for kids typically who have medical diagnosis, diabetes, anxiety, etc. and need individualized plans. There are 29 students in grades 6-12 who are being helped in this area. Information is assessed on these students every two weeks. She also reaches out to parents.

The majority of her work is as a <u>Career Coach</u>. Counselors have served in this role for years, but Jenny stated that counselors are overwhelmed and more so since COVID. This is an area that she has taken over.

The program includes self-understanding. Each student in grades 6-10 take assessments to learn more about themselves, careers, and pathways to those careers.

In 8<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> grades in a classroom setting, topics such as cumulative grade point average, ACT, high school offering, IWCC college offerings, extra-curricular activities are covered and 8<sup>th</sup> graders create a resume which they update each year. Also in these grades post high school options are discussed: apprenticeship, trade

school, public colleges, private colleges, military, and workforce.

Individual meetings are held with 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> graders regarding post high school options, current career thoughts, updated 4-year plan, and are shown how to research pathways based on assessments. Job shadowing currently happens in 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade. <u>Career Discovery</u> through lowa Western Community College has 39 students signed up this spring. Over time, Jenny hopes this will grow.

Treynor Career Days is for all students in grades 9-11 (182 students). Berens is looking for businesses to participate. At the April 23 Treynor Career Days, her goal is for kids to pick the four businesses they want to learn about.

In addition, there are large group visits by grade level to area <u>Trade/Career Expos, Forums, and College Fairs</u>. Feedback from the students about who they talked to and what they learned is received.

There are also <u>Small Group Site Visits</u> to companies such as AgriVision, HGM, Lozier, and Trade Expos. Jenny was delighted that the Agri Vision visit resulted in two students getting internships this year.

A goal Berens has is to continue increasing the percentage of 1) Students who earn Industry Recognition Credentials- went from 15 to 21% 2) Students who earn College Credits during high school – went from 90 – 98% earning 1 or more credits 3) Students who participate in Work Based Learning Experiences – went from 30 to 75%. The latter includes: Career Readiness Class, the Cardinal Café, Avenue Scholars, Job Shadows, Trade Exploration Days, Career Discovery Days and Site Visits.

When asked, Jenny said she didn't have a model for building this program, but it has morphed. Part of her role comes from Aspire – each school district had the money provided for needs. Only Treynor and AvoHa used the funds in this way.
