Christina Bateman, Faith's Friends



Christina Bateman, a native of Atlantic who returned home after receiving her BS and Masters' Degree from Bellevue University, is in the real estate business and active in the community in Atlantic. She is married to Joe and together they have six kids plus four from his previous marriage.

In 2010 Christina was expecting their first child and at 17 weeks, there was an abnormality found in a blood test and confirmed then by ultrasounds and genetic testing. At 20 weeks there was fluid pressing on the heart and lungs of the baby. Air sacks weren't able to form. Faith was born on July 12 and lived 1.5 hrs. and one eye opened the first half hour and died in Christina's arms.

Genetic testing determined that the parents were not carriers of the abnormality. In October

2017 they lost twin daughters during the pregnancy. Christina stated, "No matter the age, there is no easy time in losing a child. Loss is based on the love of a child no matter the age."

Christina knew that in some way she wanted to help others. In 2015 after seeing a temporary marker at a baby's grave that had been there since 2009, she knew God was calling her to help others to relieve financial burdens for families who have lost a child for funeral, burial, and headstone costs.

Faith's Friends, a 501©3 was formed in March, 2017. The non-profit began with their own donation of \$5000. The first year they helped families in Cass Co. In 2018 they spread to counties around them. In 2019 they started helping families in all of Nebraska and Iowa.

Christina stated that most funeral homes donate their time. Faith's Friends helps with the costs for children in the womb up to age 18 – a total of \$4000 is possible.

Since 2017 Faith's Friends has donated \$171,000 for 80 children. Most that have been helped live within 60 miles of Atlantic. In the beginning, Christina would search for people with losses, but now people reach out to her. Faith's Friends mainly raises funds with an annual celerity waiter fundraiser. It is a fun thing and local people dress up with a theme and wait on guests who have been invited for dinner. Funds are raised by giving tips to the waiter for serving them and doing unusual fun things when asked by the guests! This year they raised \$42,000.

Remembrance lights are sponsored by various people and sit on the tables at the event. The parents can pick the shape, design, and color of the light that has the child's name on it. Families are invited to come to this event and the dinner is paid for by Faith's Friends. Multiple families have come.

Faith's Friends has been a double blessing for Christina. She is able to help others who have experienced this pain, and it makes her daughters' lives continue to matter.

Christina and her husband together have two boys, 11 and 9, and a daughter, 5. She said from the beginning she has taken the children to funerals/visitations. They make trips to the cemetery and talk about their sisters in Heaven. Christina expressed her strong faith, stating Romans 8:28 ("For all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose.") and believes her girls were supposed to go to Heaven when they did, God fulfilled their purpose and has brought good out of their lives.
