# Matt Hansmann, Treynor Science Teacher



Matt Hansmann,
Treynor High School
Science Teacher since
2020, graduated from
Boyden-Hull High School
in 2015 and from
Northwestern College in
2020, and is now
working on his Masters'
in Administration.

In 2023 Mr. Hansmann received the Treynor American Legion Outstanding Teacher Award and the Charles Lakin Outstanding Teacher Award.

Matt was introduced by Steve Irvin, former Counselor at Treynor High School, who while substituting for Mrs. Floeschinger this year stated he is so impressed with the good young teachers at Treynor.

Matt is married to his wife, Kelsey, and they are expecting their first child in November. They live in Council Bluffs which splits both of their drives to work. They love to watch Jeopardy, visit baseball stadiums, and try new restaurants in Omaha and Council Bluffs.

Hansmann teaches 9-10<sup>th</sup> grade Biology and 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade Chemistry. He also currently teaches Forensic Science, Microbology, and Nutrition. He coaches the Quiz Bowl team. He is also the head speech coach and is excited that Treynor set a new record of having 8 individuals qualify for All-State Speech. In addition, he is a mentor, serves on the Building Leadership Team, Student Assistance Team and the District Leadership Team.

Matt shared pictures of examples of classroom activities. 1) Forensic Science – one thing learned was what a sketch artist does and they practiced drawing with someone describing what was seen. Some students visited the CSI lab in CB. 2) Chemistry – They learn lab safety and are dealing with fire by Day 3. He tries to get the students in the lab as often as possible. 3)

Biology: – Soap bubbles are similar to cell membranes and the students have a challenge at the end of the day to make the largest bubble. The class does chalk drawings on sidewalks of what is in a cell. This helps break up classroom work of lectures and notes.

Jacob Hedger, Principal during Matt's first two years, became his encourager and mentor to pursuing an administrative degree. He believes developing relationships and encouraging students with their concerns and problems draws him to eventually being an administrator in the distant future.

Hansmann addressed the question of why Treynor students are such good students. He feels the demographics of families contributes plus having support at home for students to do their best. The community shows up at their activities. Treynor has caring and trusting adults. He said the kids at Treynor are overall good students and try hard.
