PROGRAM: Mr. Herb Hansen of the Pottawattamie Civil Defense Office came to provide the program. It is not practical for us to try to "report" his comments, etc. in this brief newsletter. However, the message is of critical concern to you and your family! Directly or indirectly RADON causes more deaths than almost any other chemical or drug in our society.

Radon can be found in variable volume everywhere! You need a testing kit to see whether it is in your basement. It enters through cracks in the walls and floors. Iowa State University has, "The Iowa Radon Project." The staff administering the Project will provide detection kits you can use to check your home.

A reason Radon does not get "credit" for the damage it causes is that it causes diseases and respiratory problems which get the credit. It is important for us to understand this detail. A persistent health problem and one which seems to infect the entire family, could well "be caused by" RADON.
